

**Artist salutes** trainee teachers lost in police and gangs atrocity

### EARE MISSING 43 international drive to remember 43 students kidnapped and feared murdered in Mexico.

The trainee teachers studied at a college in Guerrero state and disappeared on

September 26 last year. Portraits of the students - made by Glasgow artist Jan Nimmo - have been used by their

The young men were in buses on their way to a political protest when they came under fire from police. Attacks by officers that night left

six people dead and at least 17 wounded. The fate of the students is unclear amid claims they were kidnapped by police and handed to a drug cartel who murdered them.

MORA VENANCIO

The government claim officers gave the students to a gang called Guerreros Unidos. They allegedly took the students to a rubbish tip outside the town of Cocula, where they killed

them and burned them on a huge pyre of tyres. The families of the missing men refuse to believe this and have campaigned for answers. Nimmo's pictures of the students were shown in the US at an event in Eugene, Oregon, and on a demonstration in New York.

Jan said: "I had been following events surrounding the disappearance of the students in the Mexican press and on Twitter and Facebook. As someone who had travelled to Guerrero, what happened to the students mattered to me.

"There have been 22,000 to 25,000 disappearances in Mexico over the last eight years, a ridiculously high number, but somehow the students going missing in Iguala not only

got to me but to many ordinary Mexicans. There was a call for illustrators to show solidarity and I responded. The idea was for the students to be identified as people, not statistics."

The students' disappearance was the biggest scandal to face Mexico's president Enrique Peria Nieto and led to nationwide protests and
